If you have any questions, **please contact** *Andrea Shimek* in the parish office. This is an ongoing effort that will run throughout the school year, ending in June 2026.


Ways to support the Backpack Buddies Program:

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE: HOMILY SUMMARY

Friends, i wanted to share with you a few key insights from my two homilies given at the vigil and feast day of our Lady of Guadalupe:

The celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe is not simply a remembrance of an event that occurred nearly 500 years ago. It is the celebration of a living mystery, a work of divine evangelization that began long before 1531 and continues to shape hearts, cultures, and faith today.

Recent historical, anthropological, and theological studies reveal something extraordinary: God had been preparing the peoples of Mesoamerica for the Gospel for centuries. Indigenous cultures spoke of the "flowery world", a spiritual realm of beauty, truth, song, and harmony, where heaven and earth would meet. Their ancient poems expressed a longing for this world, yet ended with a painful question: "How can an unworthy human enter such a place?" Only the "God who is near and far" could make this possible.

The apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe is the divine answer to that unfinished longing. In the *Nican Mopohua*, the original narrative of Guadalupe, Juan Diego ascends the hill amid birdsong and radiant beauty and asks if he has arrived at the "mundo florido" of his ancestors.

Mary responds by revealing herself as the Mother of the true God, the One who gives life. The Gospel is not imposed from outside; it is fulfilled from within the deepest desires of a people.

Guadalupe also reveals herself as a Mother who unites worlds. Her image is mestiza, neither fully European nor fully Indigenous, but a living bridge of reconciliation. What divided peoples could not heal by force, God healed through tenderness. Violence subsided, hearts opened, and evangelization flourished.

She is also the Mother of migrants. Very quickly, copies of her image traveled back to Spain and later throughout the world. Families separated by oceans found unity through her image. Today, migrants continue to carry her in medals, prayer cards, tattoos, and home altars. Wherever her image is, there is a sense of home.

Finally, Our Lady of Guadalupe teaches us that beauty evangelizes. Her image speaks before words are spoken. Beauty opens the soul, prepares the heart, and leads to truth. When the Church celebrates the liturgy with reverence and care, the same mystery unfolds: people encounter God even before they fully understand Him. And then we are pointed towards each other, to see the beauty of God in each person created in God's image. Beauty then is transformed into action as we seek to care for one another with reverence, especially the poor.

Guadalupe is not only history. She is a living Gospel, still revealing what we need to see.

NUESTRA SEÑORA DE GUADALUPE: RESUMEN DE LA HOMILÍA

Amigos, quería compartir con ustedes algunas reflexiones claves de mis dos homilías pronunciadas en el día de la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe:

La celebración de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe no es simplemente un recuerdo de un acontecimiento ocurrido hace casi 500 años. Es la celebración de un misterio vivo, una obra de evangelización divina que comenzó mucho antes de 1531 y continúa moldeando corazones, culturas y la fe hoy.

Estudios históricos, antropológicos y teológicos recientes revelan algo extraordinario: Dios había estado preparando a los pueblos de Mesoamérica para el Evangelio durante siglos. Las culturas indígenas hablaban del "mundo florido", un reino espiritual de belleza, verdad, canto y armonía, donde el cielo y la tierra se encontrarían. Sus antiguos poemas expresaban un anhelo por este mundo, pero terminaban con una pregunta dolorosa: "¿Cómo puede un ser humano indigno entrar en un lugar así?". Solo el "Dios que está cerca y lejos" podía hacerlo posible.

La aparición de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe es la respuesta divina a ese anhelo insatisfecho. En el Nican Mopohua, la narración original de Guadalupe, Juan Diego asciende la colina entre el canto de los pájaros y una radiante belleza, y pregunta si ha llegado al florido mundo de sus antepasados.

María responde revelándose como la Madre del verdadero Dios, Aquel que da la vida. El Evangelio no se impone desde fuera; se cumple desde los deseos más profundos de un pueblo.

Guadalupe también se revela como una Madre que une mundos. Su imagen es mestiza, ni completamente europea ni completamente indígena, sino un puente viviente de reconciliación. Lo que los pueblos divididos no pudieron sanar por la fuerza, Dios lo sanó con ternura. La violencia cesó, los corazones se abrieron y la evangelización floreció.

También es la Madre de los migrantes. Rápidamente, copias de su imagen viajaron de regreso a España y luego por todo el mundo. Familias separadas por océanos encontraron unidad a través de su imagen. Hoy, los migrantes continúan llevándola en medallas, estampas, tatuajes y altares domésticos. Dondequiera que esté su imagen, hay una sensación de hogar.

Finalmente, Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe nos enseña que la belleza evangeliza. Su imagen habla antes de que se pronuncien las palabras. La belleza abre el alma, prepara el corazón y conduce a la verdad. Cuando la Iglesia celebra la liturgia con reverencia y cuidado, se revela el mismo misterio: las personas se encuentran con Dios incluso antes de comprenderlo plenamente. Y entonces nos orientamos unos a otros para ver la belleza de Dios en cada persona creada a su imagen. La belleza se transforma entonces en acción al procurar cuidarnos unos a otros con reverencia, especialmente a los pobres.

Guadalupe no es solo historia. Es un Evangelio vivo que sigue revelando lo que necesitamos ver.


