# Thanks to our Holiday Teams!

In case you missed it two weeks ago, here is something from the desk of Stewardship and Outreach Ministry.

The *Knights of Columbus* recognized a need and stepped in to assist with directing traffic for the Christmas Masses by guiding parishioners to available spots in our lot and to overflow parking at Covington Elementary School, ensuring smooth parking for all worshipers. This year, attendance was remarkable: 752 people participated in the Children's Christmas Eve Mass, 527 attended the 7:00 pm Mass, and 367 joined us for the 10:00 pm Mass. On Christmas Day at 10:00 am, we welcomed 542 people, a 26% increase over last year. Thank you to members of our Knights of Columbus: **Bailey Cooksey, Mark Rosenberger, Gilbert Tulop, and Jose Zuniga**, for your generous service with traffic control during our Christmas Masses!

To all who donated items and gifts to our *Giving Tree* - thank you! Like our Thanksgiving meal program, *Giving Tree* allows us to invite those experiencing poverty to participate in our cultural tradition of gift giving on Christmas Day. Your generosity sends a message of hope to all children.

We served 35 St. Vincent de Paul families, 10 community and parish families, and an additional number of families of service members stationed at Joint Base Lewis-McChord. In total, 144 children ages 1–17 experienced a brighter, happier Christmas!

## Happy Birthday St. John the Baptist! January 1991



Our journey started in the fall of 1990, when **Father Jack Walmesley** was assigned to establish a new parish in the Covington area. Ten acres of land had been set aside by the Seattle Archdiocese to build a new church, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church. The rest, they say, is history!

Here's a snapshot of **our journey**:

- January 1991 - First Mass of the Catholic Community of Covington celebrated at Horizon Elementary School with about 100 families
- March 1991 - **Archbishop Raymond Hunthausen** approves the name of “St. John the Baptist Catholic Church”
- July 1991 - **Sister Carol Ann McMullen**, SNJM, joined **Father Jack** in starting the religious formation program
- September 1992 - The building of stewardship begins with home visits
- January 1995 - Ground was broken for church sanctuary and for office space
- January 1996 - The church sanctuary was dedicated; parish grows to 600 families
- September 2000 - The first Life Teen Mass was celebrated
- November 2000 - Construction of education/social center begins; parish grows to 820 families
- August 2001 - Grand opening of the McMullen Center (named after **Sister Carol Ann McMullen**); parish grows to 1,000 families
- July 2002 - **Father Walmesley** moves to another parish as **Father Jim Coyne** takes over
- July 2021 - **Father Jim** retires, and we welcomed **Father Bill McKee** as our new pastor
- July 2024 - **Father Bill** retires, and we welcomed **Father Carlos Orozco** as our new pastor and **Father Crispin Okoth** as our new vicar as we join Holy Spirit Parish as “Family 30.”

Today, we are **1153 families** strong today and counting!

## Serving Our Neighbors in Need

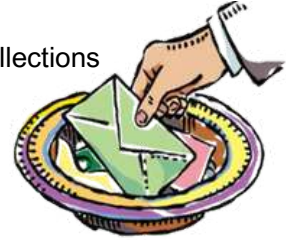

## Honoring a Loved One At a Mass

One simple way we care for one another as a faith community is by praying by name. You are encouraged to add a Loved One in our Parish Prayers.

### Universal Prayer List (Prayers of the Faithful):

- You can request a name to be included on our universal prayer list. These names are read aloud at Mass during the Prayers of the Faithful (before the Offertory) and are also printed in our weekly bulletin. If someone is sick, we must have their permission to include their name, since this prayer request is public. There is no donation expected for prayer list requests, including those who have recently died or for an anniversary of death.

### Mass Intentions:

- You can also request a Mass intention - having a Mass offered for the intention of a specific individual. Mass intentions are available for our weekday Masses:

Wednesday - 9:00 am  
Thursday - 6:30 pm

It's customary to make a donation when reserving a Mass intention date; the suggested donation is \$20 - \$50.

## SEVEN THEMES OF CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

# Mustard Seed Commitments

In the Parable of the Mustard Seed, Jesus tells us, “The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the ‘birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches’” (Mt. 13:31-32). How are we called to respond to Jesus’ example of the mustard seed? How can our small acts of faith bear great fruit for our lives and the lives of those around us?

**Mustard seed commitments are concrete actions such as changes in lifestyle or habits, that someone can easily adopt. This resource can help inspire individuals or communities to take modest but sustainable commitments. See below examples that relate to each theme of Catholic social teaching.**

### Life and Dignity of the Human Person

Commit to greeting and speaking respectfully to someone who is ignored (e.g. someone who works at your parish, a neighbor, a homeless person), ensuring you treat each person you encounter with dignity.

### Rights and Responsibilities

Eat one simple meal per week and donate what you’d have spent to a local shelter or ministry; or volunteer monthly at a soup kitchen or food pantry.

### Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers

Support fair-wage businesses; buy from companies that pay their employees well; or consciously avoid buying from companies known for unfair labor practices.

### Care for God’s Creation

Reduce single-use plastics at home; commit to using public transportation, carpooling, or biking at least sometimes; plant a small garden or support tree-planting/care for green spaces.

### Call to Family, Community, and Participation

Pledge to attend one additional parish meeting or community event each month (e.g. parish council, youth ministry, town hall) and encourage others to bring someone who is not usually involved.

### Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

Commit to being more informed about one local policy issue (housing, education, healthcare). Write or call a local official at least once a year about that issue.

### Solidarity

Visit the website of Caritas and Catholic Relief Services and learn about their efforts to address global issues such as poverty, disease, underdevelopment, climate change and migration.

### Action:

Review the mustard seed commitment prompts for each CST theme. You can write your own commitments on the back of this sheet and then share them with others to have faith like a mustard seed!

## IN TIMES OF CRISIS: THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS STILL HERE

Many entered the **new year** with hope, only to feel that we are already off to a **difficult start**. From the situation in **Venezuela** to ongoing debates around **immigration enforcement** in the United States, and the many other conflicts unfolding across our nation and world, the weight of global events is heavy.

Over the past week, I have heard a wide range of emotions, frustration, anger, disillusionment, confusion, indifference, hope, and even excitement, often about the very same situations, from people whose hearts genuinely seek the good. This tells us two things: how deeply divided we remain, and how complex these realities truly are. Where some see issues as black and white, others recognize many gray areas.

I find myself struggling somewhere in between. We all have opinions, and I have my own. While I strive to stay informed, remain balanced, avoid echo chambers, and genuinely listen to others, as Pope Francis continually invited us to do, what I think personally remains just that, an opinion. So when people ask what I think about a particular issue, I try to hold my views with humility and instead offer the one truth not subject to my feelings: the Gospel, the Good News. This is what we proclaimed at Christmas, celebrated at Epiphany, and continue this weekend with the Baptism of the Lord: **"The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand"** (cf. Mt 3:2; 4:17).

This is no mere mantra for optimism. It is a reality rooted in God's irrevocable blessing upon His people.

As the ancient priestly blessing reminds us:  
*The Lord bless you and keep you;  
The Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you;  
The Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.*

In the fullness of time, God sent His Son, born of a woman, to redeem us and make us adopted children, heirs through the Spirit who cries out, "Abba! Father!" The shepherds found Mary treasuring these mysteries in her heart, pondering the name given by the angel, Jesus, "God saves." Mary, the Holy Mother of God, models this posture for us: in a broken world, she ponders, blesses, and brings forth peace.

So I humbly ask this of you as a New Year's resolution. No matter what is happening in the world, no matter where you stand on particular issues, let us not fall into the temptation to respond like everyone else.

## EN TIEMPOS DE CRISIS: EL REINO DE DIOS SIGUE AQUÍ

Muchos comenzaron el año nuevo con esperanza, solo para sentir que ya hemos tenido un comienzo difícil. Desde la situación en Venezuela hasta los debates en curso sobre la aplicación de la ley migratoria en Estados Unidos, y los muchos otros conflictos que se desarrollan en nuestro país y el mundo, el peso de los acontecimientos globales es abrumador.

Durante la última semana, he escuchado una amplia gama de emociones: frustración, ira, desilusión, confusión, indiferencia, esperanza e incluso entusiasmo, a menudo sobre las mismas situaciones, de personas cuyo corazón busca sinceramente el bien. Esto nos dice dos cosas: cuán profundamente divididos seguimos y cuán complejas son estas realidades. Donde algunos ven los problemas como algo blanco o negro, otros reconocen muchas zonas grises.

Me encuentro en un punto intermedio. Todos tenemos opiniones, y yo tengo las mías. Aunque me esfuerzo por mantenerme informado, ser equilibrado, evitar las cámaras de eco y escuchar atentamente a los demás, como el Papa Francisco nos invitaba constantemente a hacer, lo que pienso personalmente sigue siendo solo eso, una opinión. Así que, cuando me preguntan qué pienso sobre un tema en particular, intento mantener mi punto de vista con humildad y, en cambio, ofrecer la única verdad que no está sujeta a mis sentimientos: el Evangelio, la Buena Nueva. Esto es lo que proclamamos en Navidad, celebramos en la Epifanía y continuamos este fin de semana con el Bautismo del Señor: «El Reino de los Cielos está cerca» (cf. Mt 3,2; 4,17).

Esto no es un simple mantra para el optimismo. Es una realidad arraigada en la bendición irrevocable de Dios sobre su pueblo. Como nos recuerda la antigua bendición sacerdotal:

*El Señor te bendiga y te guarde;*

*el Señor haga resplandecer su rostro sobre ti, y tenga de ti misericordia;*

*El Señor alce sobre ti su rostro, y te conceda paz.*

Somos católicos; somos un signo de comunión entre Dios y la humanidad, reflejando la vida de la Trinidad en nuestras familias, la «iglesia doméstica», donde aprendemos la perseverancia, el perdón y la adoración.

En este espíritu jubilar de misericordia, que la Santa Madre de Dios interceda por nuestra familia parroquial. Que comencemos este año de nuevo, bendecidos, llenos de gracia y en paz.
