

# Discover Fire



## 14 RULES FOR DISCERNMENT OF SPIRITS

**St. Ignatius of Loyola**, founder of the Jesuits and one of my favorite saints, developed the Rules for the Discernment of Spirits during a long season of suffering and prayer. After a cannonball shattered his leg in battle, Ignatius was confined to months of recovery. With little to do, he read two very different kinds of books, heroic stories of knights and battles, and the lives of the saints.

What changed his life was not simply what he read, but what he noticed happening within him. The heroic stories excited him for a moment, but left him restless and empty. The lives of the saints stirred a deeper joy, peace, and desire for God that endured. By paying attention to these interior movements, Ignatius began to recognize **how God speaks through the heart**.

From this experience came the **14 Rules for Discernment of Spirits**. For over 500 years, these rules have nourished the Church and shaped the spiritual lives of countless Christians. They have deeply influenced saints such as St. Teresa of Ávila, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, St. John Paul II, and St. Teresa of Calcutta, all of whom learned to listen carefully to the movements of God within their hearts. Ignatian discernment continues to guide retreatants, religious, priests, and laypeople around the world today.

These rules are a practical spiritual tool for daily life, helping us recognize what draws us closer to God and what subtly pulls us away. They have also profoundly shaped my own spirituality, how I pray, how I make decisions, and how I try to listen to God in the midst of ministry and daily life.

**Over the next few weeks**, I would like to introduce these rules to our parish community, taking two or three rules at a time in each bulletin insert. To prepare, here are some key vocabularies that St. Ignatius uses in his rules.

### Discernment of Spirits

The prayerful practice of recognizing where our thoughts, desires, and impulses come from, and where they lead. Discernment considers their origin, direction, and fruits, not just how they feel.

### Enemy (of human nature)

St. Ignatius' term for the spiritual opposition that seeks to discourage, confuse, and exploit our weaknesses, especially when we are growing closer to God.

### Spirits

The influences that move the soul. Good spirits lead toward faith, hope, love, humility, and trust in God. Evil spirits and disordered passions lead toward sin, isolation, and despair.

### Consolation

Interior movements that draw us toward God, marked by peace, joy, gratitude, renewed faith, hope, love, and a desire to pray or serve.

### Desolation

Interior movements marked by darkness, restlessness, discouragement, sadness, or spiritual dryness, which are not signs of God's absence but invitations to perseverance.

My hope is that, together, we can further learn to recognize God's quiet work within our hearts and grow in freedom, wisdom, and trust as disciples of Christ, especially in a world filled with conflict.

# LAS 14 REGLAS DE DISCERNIMIENTO DE LOS ESPÍRITUS

**San Ignacio de Loyola**, fundador de la Compañía de Jesús y uno de mis santos favoritos, desarrolló las Reglas de discernimiento de los espíritus durante un largo tiempo de sufrimiento y oración. Después de que una bala de cañón destrozara su pierna en batalla, Ignacio quedó confinado durante meses. Con poco que hacer, comenzó a leer dos tipos de libros muy distintos, relatos de caballería y hazañas heroicas, y las vidas de los santos.

Lo que transformó su vida no fue solo lo que leía, sino lo que comenzó a notar dentro de sí. Las historias heroicas lo entusiasmaban por un momento, pero lo dejaban inquieto y vacío. En cambio, las vidas de los santos despertaban una alegría más profunda, una paz interior y un deseo duradero de servir a Dios. Prestando atención a estas mociones del alma, Ignacio empezó a **reconocer cómo Dios habla al corazón**.

De esta experiencia nacieron las **14 Reglas de discernimiento de los espíritus**. Desde hace más de 500 años, estas reglas han nutrido la vida espiritual de la Iglesia y han formado a innumerables cristianos. Han influido profundamente en santos como Santa Teresa de Ávila, Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús, San Juan Pablo II y Santa Teresa de Calcuta, quienes aprendieron a escuchar con atención las mociones de Dios en su interior. Hoy en día, el discernimiento ignaciano sigue guiando a sacerdotes, religiosos y laicos en todo el mundo.

Estas reglas no son teoría abstracta. Son una herramienta espiritual muy concreta para la vida diaria, que nos ayuda a reconocer lo que nos acerca a Dios y lo que, de manera sutil, nos aleja de Él. Han marcado profundamente mi propia espiritualidad, la manera en que oro, tomo decisiones y trato de escuchar a Dios en medio del ministerio y la vida cotidiana.

Durante las próximas semanas, deseo introducir estas reglas poco a poco en nuestra comunidad parroquial, presentando dos o tres reglas en cada boletín, para aprenderlas con calma, oración y profundidad, y aplicarlas a nuestra propia vida.

## Vocabulario clave

### **Discernimiento de los espíritus**

El arte espiritual de sentir y conocer las varias mociones que se causan en el alma, para recibir las buenas y rechazar las malas. El discernimiento considera su origen, su desarrollo y sus frutos, no solo cómo se sienten.

### **Enemigo de la naturaleza humana**

Término que san Ignacio usa para referirse a la oposición espiritual que busca desanimar, inquietar y aprovechar nuestras flaquezas, especialmente cuando avanzamos en el bien.

### **Espíritus**

Las fuerzas que mueven el alma. El buen espíritu conduce a la fe, la esperanza, la caridad, la humildad y la confianza en Dios. El mal espíritu y las pasiones desordenadas conducen al pecado, al aislamiento y a la desesperanza.

### **Consolación**

Mociones interiores que atraen al alma hacia Dios, marcadas por paz, alegría, gratitud, aumento de fe, esperanza y caridad, y deseo de orar o servir.

### **Desolación**

Mociones interiores caracterizadas por oscuridad, inquietud, desaliento, tristeza o sequedad espiritual, que no indican ausencia de Dios, sino una invitación a la perseverancia.

Mi deseo es que, como comunidad, aprendamos a reconocer la acción silenciosa de Dios en el corazón y crezcamos juntos en libertad interior, sabiduría y confianza como discípulos de Cristo.


