# Discover Fire



## THE EPIPHANY: JOURNEYING WITH EMPTY HANDS

On the Solemnity of the Epiphany, we celebrate the journey of the Magi, wise seekers who followed a star to adore the newborn King. Their pilgrimage reveals a central truth of our faith:

**God allows Himself to be found by those who seek sincerely.** The Magi represent all humanity, drawn from distant places into the light of Christ, discovering that God's power is revealed not through force, but through humility.

During a silent retreat, while praying with this Gospel, God revealed to me a simple but profound truth: the greatest gift we can offer Christ is not what we bring, but our willingness to come with **empty hands**.

In prayer, I imagined myself following the Magi across moonlit desert sands. We arrived at a humble dwelling, where Mary sat holding the child Jesus. One by one, the Magi knelt and presented their gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Suddenly, I realized it was my turn.

I searched my pockets in panic, but I had nothing. Embarrassed, I said to Mary, "I'm sorry, I don't have anything to offer." She smiled and placed the baby Jesus into my arms, saying, "**Your empty hands are the perfect gift. That is exactly what He wants, so that you can hold Him.**"

There was no heavenly glow or dramatic sign, just a fragile infant. I felt nervous and unworthy. How could the all-powerful God trust Himself to me? Yet, as I looked down at Him, a deep and unexpected peace filled my heart.

This is the mystery of Epiphany: God reveals Himself not through domination, but through **vulnerability**.

Throughout that retreat, I noticed a pattern. I kept looking for God in grand signs and complex answers, yet God spoke through simplicity. I had always imagined God as distant and unapproachable, but here He was, small enough to be held.

The Magi followed a star, but the true light was found in poverty and tenderness. Epiphany teaches us that God is not a rival or a threat. He comes disarmed. A baby has no power to control or intimidate, only the power to soften hearts. Even the strongest among us become gentle when holding a newborn.

As we begin a **new year** filled with uncertainty, Epiphany invites us to hold onto what truly matters. When we come to Christ with honesty, weakness, and trust, He places Himself into our hands. Hope becomes visible again, in our families, our children, and our care for one another.

This feast asks us a simple question: **What do you bring to Christ?** The answer may feel small. But when we come with empty hands, God gives us everything.

As a community, let's approach the new year in this way together. Kneel with the Magi. Offer what you have. Hold the Savior who first chose to be held by us.

# LA EPIFANÍA: VIAJANDO CON LAS MANOS VACÍAS

En la Solemnidad de la Epifanía, celebramos el viaje de los Reyes Magos, sabios buscadores que siguieron una estrella para adorar al Rey recién nacido. Su peregrinación revela una verdad central de nuestra fe: **Dios se deja encontrar por quienes lo buscan con sinceridad**. Los Reyes Magos representan a toda la humanidad, atraída desde lugares lejanos hacia la luz de Cristo, descubriendo que el poder de Dios no se revela a través de la fuerza, sino a través de la humildad.

Durante un retiro en silencio, mientras oraba con este Evangelio, Dios me reveló una verdad simple pero profunda: **el mayor regalo que podemos ofrecer a Cristo no es lo que traemos, sino nuestra disposición a ir con las manos vacías**.

Mientras rezaba, me imaginé siguiendo a los Reyes Magos por las arenas del desierto, iluminadas por la luna. Llegamos a una humilde morada, donde María estaba sentada sosteniendo al niño Jesús. Uno a uno, los Reyes Magos se arrodillaron y ofrecieron sus ofrendas: oro, incienso y mirra. De repente, me di cuenta de que era mi turno.

Rebusqué en mis bolsillos presa del pánico, pero no encontré nada. Avergonzada, le dije a María: «Lo siento, no tengo nada que ofrecer». Ella sonrió y puso al niño Jesús en mis brazos, diciendo: **«Tus manos vacías son el regalo perfecto. Eso es exactamente lo que Él quiere, para que puedas abrazarlo»**.

No había ningún resplandor celestial ni señal dramática, solo un frágil bebé. Me sentía nervioso e indigno. ¿Cómo podía el Dios todopoderoso confiarse a mí? Sin embargo, al mirarlo, una paz profunda e inesperada llenó mi corazón. Este es el misterio de la Epifanía: Dios se revela no a través del dominio, sino a través de la **vulnerabilidad**.

A lo largo de ese retiro, noté algo. Seguía buscando a Dios en grandes señales y respuestas complejas, pero Dios me hablaba con sencillez. Siempre lo había imaginado distante e inaccesible, pero allí estaba, tan pequeño que podía abrazarlo.

Los Reyes Magos siguieron una estrella, pero la verdadera luz se encontró en la pobreza y la ternura. La Epifanía nos enseña que Dios no es un rival ni una amenaza. Viene desarmado. Un bebé no tiene poder para controlar ni intimidar, solo el poder de ablandar corazones. Incluso los más fuertes entre nosotros se vuelven tiernos al sostener a un recién nacido.

Al comenzar un **nuevo año** lleno de incertidumbre, la Epifanía nos invita a aferrarnos a lo que realmente importa. Cuando nos acercamos a Cristo con honestidad, debilidad y confianza, Él se pone en nuestras manos. La esperanza se hace visible de nuevo en nuestras familias, nuestros hijos y en nuestro cuidado mutuo.

Esta fiesta nos plantea una pregunta sencilla: **¿Qué le aportas a Cristo?** La respuesta puede parecer pequeña. Pero cuando venimos con las manos vacías, Dios nos lo da todo.

Arrodíllate con los Reyes Magos. Ofrece lo que tienes. Abraza al Salvador que primero eligió ser sostenido por nosotros.

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." (Mt 2:2)


