Lent: MORE Little Facts, Big Meaning

Last week, we listed some little facts of Lent. Here are more to ponder:

- The word "Lent" originates from the Old English word *Lenten*, which means "springtime."
- Statues and crucifixes are often draped in violet (purple) cloth during Lent to symbolize mourning, repentance, and the royalty of Christ.
- The McDonald's Filet-O-Fish was invented in 1962 by a Catholic franchise owner in Ohio to provide a meatless option during Lent.
- Beyond just giving up luxuries, Lent is a time to focus on daily scripture reading, increased prayer, and almsgiving (sharing resources with the poor).
- Lent begins Ash Wednesday and ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Sundays are not considered part of Lent, so this year Lent is only 38 days long. The 40th day would be Holy Saturday.

DISCERNMENT OF THE SPIRITS, RULES 5-7

In the past weeks, we have learned how to recognize spiritual consolation and desolation. Now St. Ignatius teaches us something essential: what to do when desolation comes.

Fifth Rule

“In time of desolation never to make a change; but to be firm and constant in the resolutions and determination in which one was the day preceding such desolation, or in the determination in which he was in the preceding consolation. Because, as in consolation it is rather the good spirit who guides and counsels us, so in desolation it is the bad, with whose counsels we cannot take a course to decide rightly.”

Desolation clouds our vision. It distorts how we see ourselves, our lives, and even God. Decisions that once felt clear now feel uncertain. Prayer feels dry. Faith feels heavy. This is precisely why Ignatius gives this rule: **do not change your good spiritual decisions during desolation.**

For example, imagine someone who has committed to daily prayer and has experienced real peace and growth. Then desolation comes. Prayer feels empty. Thoughts arise saying, “This isn’t working,” or “Why bother?” Ignatius says: do not trust those voices. Remain faithful to the path you chose when you were seeing clearly.

Sixth Rule

“Although in desolation we ought not to change our first resolutions, it is very helpful intensely to change ourselves against the same desolation, as by insisting more on prayer, meditation, on much examination, and by giving ourselves more scope in some suitable way of doing penance.”

Although we do not change our decisions, we do

change how we respond. Ignatius tells us to resist desolation actively. This means praying even when we do not feel like it. It means recalling truths of faith when doubts arise. It means becoming aware of what we are experiencing, and not simply reacting automatically.

It also means small acts of discipline. The natural response to desolation is escape, distraction, or withdrawal. Instead, Ignatius invites us to stand our ground. Even small acts matter. Ten minutes of prayer. Turning off distractions. Doing the next right thing. These small acts weaken desolation and reopen the heart to grace.

Seventh Rule

“Let him who is in desolation consider how the Lord has left him in trial in his natural powers... since he can with the Divine help, which always remains to him, though he does not clearly perceive it.”

Ignatius teaches that desolation is not a sign that God has abandoned us. God permits it as a trial, but He never removes His grace. Even when we cannot feel Him, God is still sustaining us.

A person may feel distant from God in prayer, yet continue praying. They may feel weak, yet remain faithful. In that hidden struggle, faith grows stronger and deeper. Desolation is temporary. God’s grace remains.

Next week we will continue with Rules 8 and 9.

ESPAÑOL EN EL REVERSO

DISCERNIMIENTO DE LOS ESPÍRITUS, REGLAS 5-7

En las últimas semanas, hemos aprendido a reconocer el consuelo espiritual y la desolación. Ahora San Ignacio nos enseña algo esencial: qué hacer cuando llega la desolación.

Quinta Regla: “En tiempos de desolación, nunca cambiar; sino ser firme y constante en las resoluciones y la determinación que uno tenía el día anterior a dicha desolación, o en la determinación que tenía en la consolación anterior. Porque, así como en la consolación es más bien el buen espíritu quien nos guía y aconseja, así también en la desolación es el malo, con cuyos consejos no podemos tomar el rumbo para decidir correctamente”.

La desolación nubla nuestra visión. Distorsiona cómo nos vemos a nosotros mismos, nuestras vidas e incluso a Dios. Decisiones que antes parecían claras ahora se sienten inciertas. La oración se siente seca. La fe se siente pesada. Precisamente por eso Ignacio da esta regla: no cambiéis vuestras buenas decisiones espirituales durante la desolación.

Por ejemplo, imagina a alguien que se ha comprometido a orar a diario y ha experimentado verdadera paz y crecimiento. Entonces llega la desolación. La oración se siente vacía. Surgen pensamientos que dicen: «Esto no funciona» o «¿Para qué molestarse?». Ignacio dice: no confíes en esas voces. Mantente fiel al camino que elegiste cuando veías con claridad.

Sexta Regla: “Aunque en la desolación no debemos cambiar nuestras primeras resoluciones, es muy útil cambiarnos intensamente ante la misma desolación, por ejemplo, insistiendo más en la oración, la meditación, el examen profundo y dándonos más espacio para alguna forma adecuada de penitencia”.

Aunque no cambiamos nuestras decisiones, sí cambiamos nuestra forma de responder. Ignacio nos dice que resistamos activamente a la desolación. Esto significa orar incluso cuando no tenemos ganas. Significa recordar las verdades de la fe cuando surgen dudas. Significa tomar conciencia de lo que estamos experimentando y no simplemente reaccionar automáticamente. También implica pequeños actos de disciplina. La respuesta natural a la desolación es la huida, la distracción o el retraimiento. En cambio, Ignacio nos invita a mantenernos firmes.

Incluso los pequeños actos importan. Diez minutos de oración. Dejar de lado las distracciones. Hacer lo correcto. Estos pequeños actos debilitan la desolación y abren de nuevo el corazón a la gracia.

Séptima Regla: “Que quien se encuentre desolado considere cómo el Señor lo ha dejado en prueba en sus fuerzas naturales... pues puede con la ayuda divina, que siempre le queda, aunque no la perciba claramente”.

Ignacio enseña que la desolación no es señal de que Dios nos haya abandonado. Dios la permite como prueba, pero nunca retira su gracia. Incluso cuando no podemos sentirlo, Dios todavía nos sostiene. Una persona puede sentirse distante de Dios en la oración, pero aun así sigue orando. Puede sentirse débil, pero permanece fiel. En esa lucha oculta, la fe se fortalece y se profundiza. La desolación es temporal. La gracia de Dios permanece.

La próxima semana continuaremos con las Reglas Ocho y Nueve.


