Time Change! Seder Meal and Celebration

If you open your Bible to Exodus 12, you'll find the instructions God gave the Israelites for a quick meal the night before they left Egypt. This meal, now celebrated as Passover, commemorates God's saving power, leading the people to freedom and a new national identity in the Promised Land.



Passover is an 8-day festival, and the meal - called the Seder - is traditionally shared on the first one or two days. Over time, it has drawn from many cultural traditions.

St. John the Baptist will explore the Seder on **Sunday, March 29, 2025, at 2:00 pm**, with a potluck meal as part of the celebration. **Seats are limited to 60**, and kids and families are especially welcome.





ST. PATRICK' DAY

Faith, Heritage, and Tradition



St. Patrick, 5th-century missionary and bishop who became patron saint and national apostle of Ireland.

DID YOU KNOW?

St. Patrick's feast day is celebrated each year on **March 17**, the traditional date of his death, and he is one of the patron saints of Ireland.

St. Patrick is credited with helping to **spread Christianity** in Ireland by establishing churches, monasteries, and schools.

St. Patrick was **not born in Ireland**. He was born in Roman Britain, taken to Ireland as a young man, escaped, and later returned as a missionary.

Although **green** is now the color most associated with St. Patrick's Day, earlier traditions also linked St. Patrick with **blue**.

St. Patrick's Day began as a **religious feast day** in Ireland, but over time it also became a broader celebration of Irish culture and heritage around the world.

One of the prayers traditionally linked to St. Patrick is called **St. Patrick's Breastplate**, or **The Lorica of St. Patrick**. It is a prayer of trust in God's protection and is especially known for the line, "Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me." The prayer has long been treasured in Irish Christian tradition, even though scholars debate whether Patrick himself wrote it.

THE SAN PATRICIOS: A STORY OF IRISH- MEXICAN SOLIDARITY

During the Mexican-American War (1846–1848), a battalion made up largely of Irish immigrants, led by John Riley, was sent by the United States to fight in Mexico. Facing prejudice and limited opportunities at home, many had joined the military out of necessity.

Arriving in Mexico, they recognized a deep connection with the Mexican people, "these people are poor just like us. They are Catholics, just like us." They chose to fight on the Mexican side and became known as the San Patricios. In Mexico, they are remembered as heroes for their courage and conviction.

Their story remains a powerful reminder of the bond between the Irish and Mexican peoples, rooted in faith, courage, and solidarity.



THE LEGEND OF THE SHAMROCK

A national symbol rooted in ministry

According to Irish tradition, St. Patrick used the shamrock to help explain the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Just as the shamrock has three leaves on one stem, he taught that God is Three Persons in one.

This story comes from legend rather than Patrick's own writings, but it remains one of the most beloved symbols of St. Patrick's Day.
