Sharing Faith Across Borders: Reflections from Guatemala

In late February, members of our parish had the blessing of visiting our sister parish, Union de las Aldeas Corpus Christi, in the San Marcos region of Guatemala. Their journey was a meaningful opportunity to deepen relationships, witness the faith of the community, and learn more about both the challenges and hopes shared by our brothers and sisters in Central America. Please enjoy the following reflection from **Kathy Wickward**, who traveled with the team to Guatemala.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Jim Tanasse, Veronica Nava, and I were blessed to travel to our sister parish, Union de las Aldeas Corpus Christi, on February 24 - March 4. Our previous hosts, **Rudy and Myra Angel**, were again hosts for us in San Sebastian, and we were also treated to a tour of the Ulew farm and San Juan la Laguna by our partner organization, SERES, which works with youth to champion projects in their communities. We travelled with two representatives of SERES, who met with the youth of the parish.

As Sunday was a festival day in the San Marcos region, we attended a Mass where the bringing up of gifts included live chickens! After the Mass, we met with the Pastoral Council, comprised of members of all 11 churches in the parish. They described three areas of need: 1) Many elderly village residents are unable to access care and medicine, relying on neighbors for help; medicine is prohibitively expensive. 2) Reliable access to water is becoming a greater problem. Springs, or "nacimientos," such as the one pictured on the cover of the bulletin, are on private property and are unmanaged in rural areas. 3) Refuse removal is a problem, leading to water contamination and other issues. A bright spot has been the growth of two of the parish's youth ministries. We took part in a field day at Serchil (see photo on front of bulletin) with sack races, a scavenger hunt, trivia, and musical chairs.

The parish council is working on a project that will serve all 11 communities and will keep us up to date with their plans. Meanwhile, our Guatemala team is working on a full presentation of our trip for the parish family. Fr. Santi and Sr. Mariangeles send their greetings to Family 30 on behalf of Union de las Aldeas!

Time Change! Seder Meal and Celebration

If you open your Bible to Exodus 12, you'll find the instructions God gave the Israelites for a quick meal the night before they left Egypt. This meal, now celebrated as Passover, commemorates God's saving power, leading the people to freedom and a new national identity in the Promised Land.



Passover is an 8-day festival, and the meal - called the Seder - is traditionally shared on the first one or two days. Over time, it has drawn from many cultural traditions.

St. John the Baptist will explore the Seder on **Sunday, March 29, 2025, at 2:00 pm**, with a potluck meal as part of the celebration. **Seats are limited to 60**, and kids and families are especially welcome.


Dear Friends,


