Palm Sunday: A Sacred Beginning to Holy Week

On Palm Sunday, Catholics around the world receive palm branches in remembrance of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, when the people welcomed him by laying palms before him. These palms symbolize Christ's triumphant arrival as King and his victory over sin and death. Once blessed, the palms are recognized as sacred, **connecting the faithful to the sacrifices of Holy Week**. These palms serve as a lasting reminder of faith and devotion. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, inviting us to reflect and prepare for Our Lord's Passion on Good Friday and His glorious Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Palm Sunday: Blessing of Palms and Procession Details



For Palm Sunday, Mass will begin at the McMullen Center with the blessing of the palms, followed by a procession to the church. Weather permitting, we will gather outside near the picnic tables; in case of inclement weather, we will meet inside the McMullen Center dining hall. The procession will move through the parking lot and conclude in the sanctuary.

For those with mobility or other concerns, the blessing and procession will be livestreamed. You are welcome to remain seated in the sanctuary, and blessed palms will be brought to you.

A Beautiful Easter Tribute



We invite you to help make a beautiful display of flowers around the sanctuary by **donating toward Easter flowers**. You are welcome to write the names of loved ones who have gone before us on a card. These cards will be displayed on ribbons in the narthex as a meaningful way to remember and honor them during this joyful season.

If you would like to contribute a pot or two of flowers, please **return your donation by March 29 (Palm Sunday)**. Envelopes and cards are available in the narthex. Suggested donation is \$10, but any amount will be appreciated.

And then come help us decorate the church on Saturday, April 4, at 11 am.

Time Change! Seder Meal and Celebration

If you open your Bible to Exodus 12, you'll find the instructions God gave the Israelites for a quick meal the night before they left Egypt. This meal, now called Passover, commemorates God's saving power, which led the people to freedom and a new national identity in the Promised Land.



Passover is an 8-day festival, and the meal—the Seder—is traditionally shared on the first one or two days. Over time, it has incorporated many cultural traditions.

St. John the Baptist will explore the Seder on **Sunday, March 29, 2026, at 2:00 pm**, with a potluck meal as part of the celebration. **There are still many seats available! If you're looking for something to do on Sunday, please join us! Kids and families are especially welcome.**

No registration is needed; potluck dishes are welcome but not required.

Holy Week & Easter Schedule Updates and Important Information

There will be **no first Friday Masses on April 3**, as it is Good Friday. Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the only days of the year when Mass is not celebrated worldwide. This observance commemorates Christ's death on the cross and is marked by a sacred liturgical fast that begins after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and continues through Holy Saturday until the celebration of the Resurrection at the Easter Vigil.

Please also note that **on Easter Sunday, April 5, there will only be two Masses, 9:00 am and 11:30 am**. There will be **no 5:30 pm Mass**.

Overflow parking is available at the school across the street. Kindly refrain from parking in the space reserved for our priest.

Stations of the Cross



Please join us on Good Friday for the final Stations of the Cross before Easter. The meditations will be led by the Life, Justice, and Peace Commission and will take place on **Friday, April 3, 2026, at 3:00 p.m** in the sanctuary. Later that evening, the **Passion of the Lord will be celebrated at 6:00 p.m**. Please note that there will be no fish dinner on Good Friday.

Spotlight on Ministries: Yarning for Community

Veiling Statues and Images During Lent

You may have noticed that the statues and images in the sanctuary are covered in purple cloth. Why are they covered?

From the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Passion Sunday - March 22 this year) until Easter, purple cloths cover statues and images to signify mourning, repentance, and focus on Jesus’ Passion. Purple symbolizes both repentance and Christ’s royalty, reminding us of his suffering and hidden divinity. Covering the images serves as a visual penance, helping the faithful set aside distractions, deepen reflection, and anticipate the joy of the Resurrection.

This tradition invites us to enter more fully into the solemnity of Lent and prepares our hearts to celebrate the triumph of Easter.

Mass with Little Ones Made Easier

Little ones are always welcome at Mass! But sometimes sitting quietly for an hour (or even a few minutes) just isn’t their thing. And that’s okay! If your child needs a break, there’s no need to head home. Instead, **visit our nursery, located just east of the narthex.**

"Truly, this was the Son of God!" (Mt 26:54)

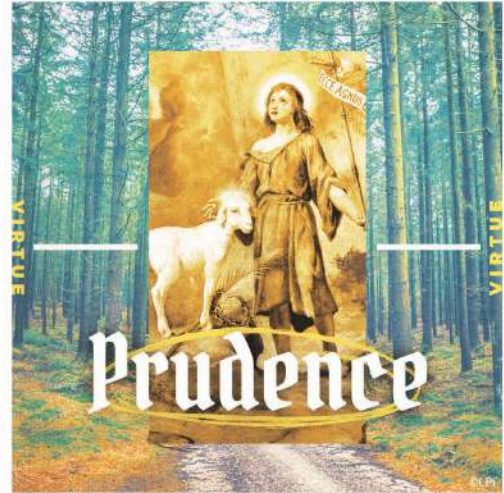
