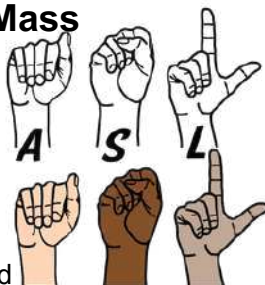

## Extend the Gift of Understanding at Mass

We have a parishioner who is deaf and would like to participate more fully in the Mass through American Sign Language (ASL). At present, she must attend Mass at St. James Cathedral in Seattle in order to have access to an ASL interpreter. It would be a great blessing to offer this ministry here at St. John the Baptist as well.

## A New Sanctuary Lamp to Highlight the Presence of Christ

In keeping with the Code of Canon Law, which states that "a special lamp... is to shine continuously before a tabernacle" (Can. 940), a candle is always kept burning beside the tabernacle in the Eucharistic Niche. While no color is required, red is the traditional choice.

When St. John the Baptist was built, the parish chose a lamp style reflecting the natural environment rather than traditional red glass. At the same time, the tabernacle was placed in a Eucharistic Niche in accordance with the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which states that "it is more in keeping with the meaning that the tabernacle where the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved not be on an altar where Mass is celebrated." The GIRM further recommends a location suitable for prayer and "readily visible to the faithful" (GIRM 315).

As the parish has grown, some have found it difficult to locate the tabernacle. To better reflect the GIRM's guidance, the Liturgy Commission has decided to install a traditional red sanctuary lamp outside the niche, making its location immediately clear to all who enter.

All components have now arrived, and the new lamp will be installed soon.

# Celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday

## Mercy at the Heart of Easter

*“Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified.”*

— Pope John Paul II

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter and focuses on the mercy and love made known through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. While this Sunday was already part of the Church’s joyful Octave of Easter, it was given the title Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II in the Jubilee Year 2000, during the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska.

St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received visions of Jesus and became known as the messenger of Divine Mercy. In one of those visions, she saw Jesus clothed in white, with red and pale rays flowing from His heart. This became the now-familiar Image of Divine Mercy.

In her diary, St. Faustina recorded Jesus saying:

*“I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls...*

*I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy.”*

At St. Faustina’s canonization Mass, Pope John Paul II reflected on the meaning of the image. He explained that the two rays represent blood and water, recalling the Gospel of John, where blood and water flow from the pierced side of Christ. The blood points to Christ’s sacrifice and the Eucharist, while the water points to Baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

There is also a meaningful connection between St. Faustina and Pope John Paul II. As Archbishop of Kraków in 1965, Karol Wojtyła opened the process that would eventually lead to her canonization. Years later, as pope, he canonized her and established Divine Mercy Sunday for the universal Church. Pope John Paul II himself was canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday in 2014.

This feast is a reminder that no one is beyond the reach of God’s mercy. Divine Mercy Sunday invites each of us to trust in Jesus, receive His mercy, and share that mercy with others.
