Wishing you all a blessed summer, and may we continue to nurture in our children a love for the Gospel.

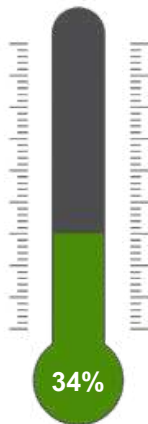

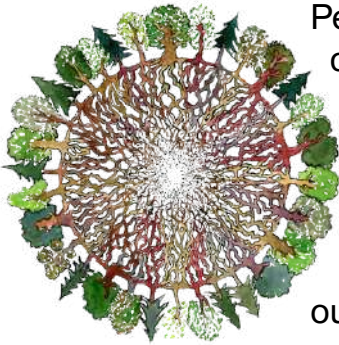
A Story of Seeds and Connection

You may know that our *Garden of the Good Shepherd* grows hundreds of pounds of fresh produce for the Covington Storehouse food bank. What you might not know is how far that garden's reach actually extends and how many people in our own neighborhood are quietly connected to that work.

Parishioner **Marge Battisti** has been instrumental for years in tending that garden as part of our Creation Care work here at St. John the Baptist. Her story below shows just what that dedication has made possible, starting with a simple request for seed packets.

Wood Wide Web...Covington Creek Nursery...Covington...Kent...

Perhaps there was a mistake! Instead of "World Wide Web," was the correct title, "Wood Wide Web?" Or perhaps you have knowledge that underground roots and fungi create a vast network of sharing resources with each other, and the title, "Wood Wide Web," is correct. Trees are the wood component in this sharing. When our parish received a request to connect with someone from the *Garden of the Good Shepherd* to donate seed packets, the vast networking began here in our neighborhood.

The path was far from a straight line, and each connection led to more possibilities. It was so exciting to experience how the Holy Spirit guides us through communication with each other. The first "God incidence" was having the *Garden of the Good Shepherd* produce poundage to be noticed by **Deedee**, who works as a volunteer bookkeeper at the Covington Storehouse and an employee at Covington Creek Nursery. She put together a sizable amount of produce and flower seed packets for us, more than our small garden would ever need! In brainstorming with others, suggestions emerged: parishioner gardeners and donors to the Covington Storehouse; Elementary School; **Barbara**, coordinator of Holy Spirit Food Pantry; and **Brenda**, Outreach at Holy Spirit who connected us to the community gardens at Hillside Church operated by World Relief. This was a significant connection to a vast network of gardeners. When I delivered the seed packets to **Lucas**, World Relief organizer, it was pouring rain and muddy. But the scheduled expansion project still took place. They were constructing new raised beds using cinder blocks. It was inspiring to encounter the dedication being given by these workers to provide ways for people to raise and harvest nutritious foods.

We are grateful for all these people, who like the underground roots and fungi, seek ways to help others by sharing ideas and resources. Hopefully, this story will inspire and bring joy.
