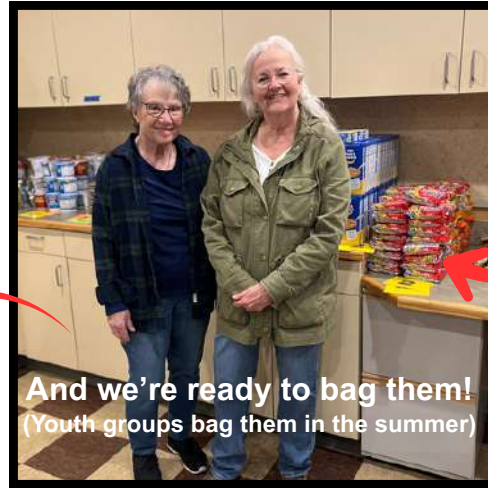

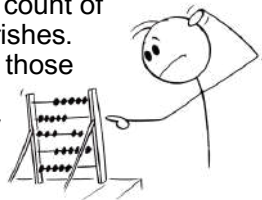

Counting More Than Heads: Why Our May Mass Attendance Matters

Each May, the Archdiocese conducts a count of attendance at all Masses across its parishes. While this practice may feel intrusive to those gathered for worship, the information collected is essential. **It helps identify attendance trends, understand demographic changes, and assess overall parish engagement.** These insights are important for effective planning and responsible allocation of resources.



The count is typically taken during the homily, when it is easiest to see the congregation. Results will be shared in a June bulletin, where you may find it interesting to compare this year's figures with those from previous years.

Flores de Mayo: A Joyful Celebration of Faith, Culture, and Community



Experience a rich cultural tradition here at St. John the Baptist by joining us for a special Mass honoring our Blessed Mother Mary. Similar to May Crowning, where Mother Mary is adorned with flowers, *Flores de Mayo* is a beloved month-long Filipino devotion that culminates in the Santacruzán pageant. During this celebration, the "reynas" (queens) represent symbolic figures that serve as a living catechism, portraying biblical characters and virtues while sharing stories of faith and history. Deeply rooted in Catholic tradition, the procession is both a devotional and cultural expression of Filipino heritage.

Join us on **May 17, 2026, at the 11:30 am Mass** to experience this beautiful celebration. The assembly for the procession will begin at 11:00 am in front of the McMullen Center, with the procession starting at 11:15 am. Following Mass, the Fil-Am Association will serve a variety of delicious Filipino dishes. All are warmly invited to take part in this festive gathering.

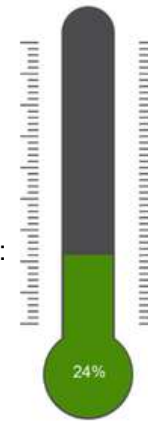

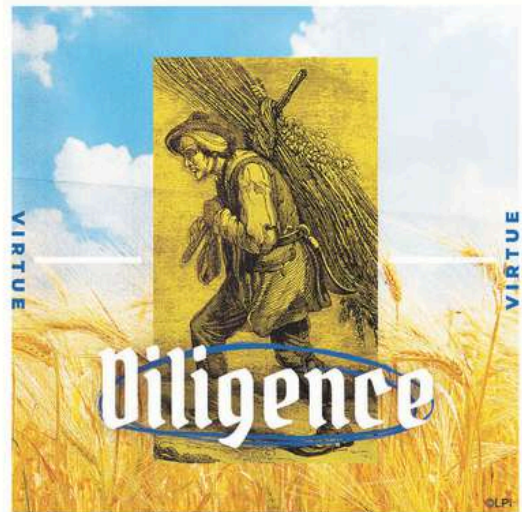
