We appreciate your understanding and invite parishioners to attend the Healing Mass at Holy Spirit Parish.



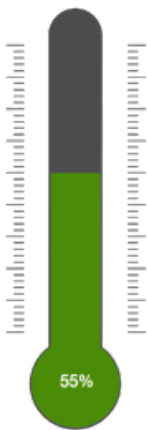

Eucharistic Minister Commissioning

Thank you to all of the Eucharistic Ministers who attended our Liturgical Minister training sessions last week. Now that you have completed your training, you are ready to be commissioned.



Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, more commonly known as Eucharistic Ministers, are formally authorized to assist in the distribution of the Eucharist. Because priests and deacons are the Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, laypersons **must receive an official mandate from the bishop or pastor to serve in this sacred ministry.** This commissioning ensures that ministers receive proper theological and practical formation and are prepared to handle the consecrated Body and Blood of Christ with reverence and care.

The **commissioning of ministers will take place at all Masses on June 7, 2026**, the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. All ministers are asked to attend one of these Masses in order to be commissioned.

Answering the Call of Stewardship Through the Backpack Buddy Ministry

As the school year comes to a close, we are filled with gratitude for the faithful stewardship and success of our Backpack Buddy ministry.

This ministry, rooted in our call to serve and care for one another, has made a meaningful difference in the lives of local children and families. Each week, backpacks filled with nourishing, kid-friendly food were sent home with students who might otherwise go without food over the weekend. Through this simple yet powerful act, we have lived out Christ's message of love in action.

This year, the program reached an average of 43 students each week, ensuring that dozens of children had consistent access to food when school meals were unavailable. Over the course of the school year, **volunteers lovingly packed more than 1,400 food bags, filled with a total of over 32,200 individual food items!** These numbers represent far more than statistics—they reflect care and dignity for every child served.

Equally inspiring is the incredible generosity of our parish community. **More than 75 parishioners supported Backpack Buddy through monetary or food item donation.** 10–15 regular dedicated volunteers faithfully showed up week after week to organize supplies, pack bags, pick up needed items, or transport bags to the school. Their commitment has been the heartbeat of this ministry.

As we head into the summer months, **we will temporarily pause donation collection.** We extend our deepest gratitude to everyone who contributed their time, talent, and treasure to make Backpack Buddy a success. This program is a beautiful reminder that when we come together in faith and service, we can achieve extraordinary things. May your summer be filled with the joy of God's presence and many abundant blessings.

You Don't Have to Grieve Alone

A 9-week Grief Support Program is being offered by Family 30's Grief Ministry. *Walking Through Grief* is an educational and inspirational program that offers support, comfort, and hope to those experiencing the loss of a loved one. This program is offered free of charge.

June 3, 2026 - July 29, 2026
7:00 pm to 8:30 pm each Wednesday evening
Meetings are online via Zoom

Over nine weekly sessions, participants will find support, understanding, and hope while learning about the journey through grief. Each session features professionally produced videos with grief experts and personal stories from individuals who share their own experiences of loss and healing. Weekly sessions include a focused topic, gentle group discussion, and simple workbook reflections to continue between meetings. Participants will receive a workbook, along with helpful tools, handouts, and articles to support them along the way.

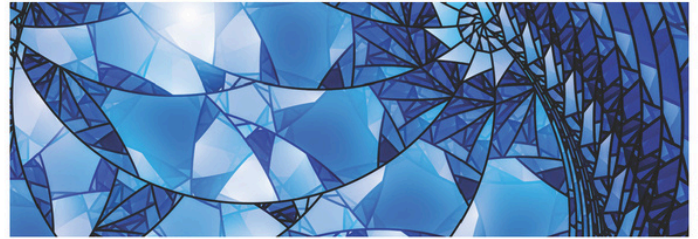

The *Ignatian Way* Spiritual Companions program forms persons to listen, share the Word, and guide prayer in one-on-one and group settings. The process prepares them to guide others with authenticity, spiritual depth, and attention to God's movement.

PARTICIPANTS CAN EXPECT

- Experiential learning of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius
- Care for the whole person through retreats, rest, and prayer
- One-on-one coaching and spiritual direction
- Enriched learning through small cohorts of diverse participants
- A funded year-end individual or team project
- Structured support for their ministry after the formation year

The *Ignatian Way* programs are open to BIPOC (all ages) and young adults (24-39, all backgrounds) who live in the Pacific NW and are committed to sharing their faith with others: emerging leaders, lay ministers, pastors, teachers, spiritual directors, chaplains, and others seeking to deepen a call to ministry.

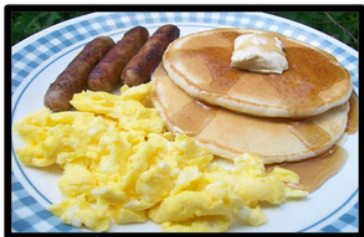

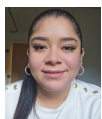
